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## Inauguration of Pantnagar Museum: Initiation of a culture of conserving the history

In the history of six decades of Pantnagar University, for the first time an initiative has been taken to establish a museum to conserve the rich legacy of Pantnagar. The museum called as the Pantnagar Museum was inaugurated on November 22<sup>nd</sup>, 2021 by Hon'ble Governor of Uttarakhand and Chancellor of Pantnagar University Lt. Gen (Retd.) Gurmit Singh in the presence of Dr. Tej Partap, Vice-Chancellor, Pantnagar University; Dr. S.K. Kashyap, Dean Agriculture, faculty members and students of the University. The hon'ble Governor wholeheartedly praised the idea of bringing up the museum which will preserve and retain a six decade-long glorified history of agricultural education of India which initiated at Pantnagar.

The Pantnagar Museum has been designed and developed under the able guidance of Dr. Kashyap. A dedicated team of faculty members, post-doctoral fellows, alumni and staff

of the University worked rigorously for a period of six months to build the museum. On the occasion of the inauguration, Dr. Kashyap shared his feelings and said that Pantnagar Museum was his long-drawn dream which started taking shape when he was working with Dr. P.L. Gautam, former Vice-Chancellor of Pantnagar University for compilation of the book titled Five Decades of Pantnagar. He further expressed his heartfelt gratitude to all those who made immense contributions in the emergence of Pantnagar Museum.

The museum has been divided into six fragments which enclose timeline exhibit, independence wall, historical revelations, research excellence, achievement display and digital demonstration. Being the harbinger of Green Revolution in India and the first agricultural university of the nation, the museum symbolizes the rigorous efforts, hard work and indomitable essence of academicians, researchers and students. It will inspire the forthcoming generations to maintain the six decade long legacy. The Pantnagar Museum is surely a befitting monument of our University reflecting the marvelous history of honour and will be a repository offering its visitors a trip down memory lane. The Mesuem is one of the salient contributions made by the IDP-NAHEP, project team of Pantnagar.

#### College students experience practice of hi-tech horticulture under RAWE programme

fter a long spell of online era, final year students of B.Sc. Agriculture of College of Agriculture, Pantnagar visited Indo-Dutch Horticulture Technologies Pvt. Ltd., a pioneer in high density production (HDP) of flowers and fruits, situated in Bhimtal, Uttarakhand under RAWE (Rural Agricultural Work Experience) programme experiencing real life farm situations and problems of farmers.

On November 17, 2021 a group of 47 students reached the campus of Indo-Dutch Horticulture Technologies Pvt. Ltd. where Mr. Sudhir Chadha and Mr. Sushant Chadha, founders of Indo-Dutch, welcomed the students. An inaugural session was held for the students and afterwards they visited the HDP apple orchard. There were regular practical classes on hydroponics, floriculture, cuttings, etc. providing hands-on experience to the students. In the village attachment segment, students visited the Ghrigrani Village and performed village mapping. Students also observed a success story of Mr. Tarun, who left his corporate job and now owns a poultry and a vegetable farm. Two students, Niharika Arora and Sheetal Bhagat volunteered for organizing online classes for farmers on apple farming advisory, an initiative by the Indo-Dutch.



The students returned to University on November 26, 2021. Dr. Arpita Sharma, Assistant Professor, Department of Agricultural Communication and Dr. Alka, Junior Research Officer, Department of Vegetable Science accompanied the students and guided them in their visit.

Ms. Niharika Arora one of the students of RAWE program shared her experience and said that it was a rejoicing experience where we were learning with fun. Despite the regular classes, we never felt drained. We worked upon hydroponics and used coco peat for the very first time. We met with villagers and felt connected with them understanding their demands and thought process.

he Leadership for Academicians Programme (LEAP), is a prestigious programme launched by the Ministry of Human Resource Development (now Ministry of Education), Government of India. Dr. J.P. Jaiswal, Professor and Senior Wheat and Barley Breeder in Department of Genetics and Plant Breeding was selected by the MHRD for this programme. It was a three weeks flagship Leadership Development training programme (2 weeks domestic and one-week foreign training) for second level academic functionaries in public-funded higher education institutions. It was conducted under the Pandit Madan Mohan Malaviya National Mission on Teachers and Teaching (PMMMNMTT) Scheme. A very high standard was kept for the selection of candidates for the LEAP. The eligibility criteria for this programme was, at least 8 years of experience in the grade of Professor by preceding year of the LEAP training; at least 3 years experience in administrative positions, impeccable integrity and high academic profile and standing preferably 30 publications in 'SCOPUS' indexed international journal, and age below 58 years.

Dr. Jaiswal attended the first part of the programme i.e. domestic training at the Tata Institute of Social Sciences (TISS), Mumbai during January 20-31, 2020. The second part was organized by the University of Pennsylvania (U-Penn), Philadelphia, USA in which Dr. Jaiswal participated during December 4-10, 2021. Besides visiting U-Penn (the first University of the USA established in 1740), he visited two other Universities of the USA, Widener University and Cabrini University. Prof. Jaiswal says selection for LEAP was indeed a great achievement as majority of the selected candidates were from IITs and NITs, and with a high portfolio. The exposure to U-Penn, Widener, and Cabrini Universities helped him learn about the prevailing education system in the US Universities and about the ecosystem, which makes education a highly successful venture, inviting thousands of overseas students for higher studies in different Universities despite very high fee structure. Besides various things, he observed that role of alumni is very significant in the overall growth of these Universities.

The learnings and experience of Dr. Jaiswal will surely be beneficial for the college in particular and university as a whole, and will inspire Pantnagar fraternity as well.

The life and works of Dr. Y.L. Nene are exemplary and a milestone in agricultural sciences. Whether it was the identification of the cause of the deadly Khaira disease or the establishment of Asian Agri History Foundation, he was a visionary and a scientist par excellence.

Two publications of the Asian Agri History Foundation were also released during the programme. One, the Hindi version of Krishna Gita and two, Jaivik Chai: Vrikshayurveda Anubhav. The Krishna Gita highlights the specialty of 20 crops and their cultivation practices in Kerala. These crops include cereals, vegetables and fruits with special emphasis on rice crop with 124 different varieties. Jaivik Chai: Vrikshayurveda Anubhav

provides information about different type of herbal Kunapjal and its importance in organic farming.

### **Eminent scientist from University of** Manitoba delivers online guest lecture

he College of Agriculture, Pantnagar organized a two session Guest Lecture series on Potential Role of Internet and Large Data Analytics in Agriculture in collaboration with the World Bank funded project IDP-NAHEP running in Pantnagar University. The sessions were organized on November 19 and November 26, 2021 on Microsoft Teams and were delivered by Dr. Digvir S. Jayas, Vice-President (Research and International) and Distinguished Professor at University of Manitoba, Toronto, Canada.

The first session focused on how large data analytics can revolutionize agriculture by improving crop management, livestock care, supply chain management, production efficiency, accurate risk assessment and tapping the potential of urban farming. The emphasis of the second session was more on climate change and usage of data analytics in combating climate change. He highlighted the implications of climate change on the agri-food systems and need of devising sustainable and environment-friendly agri-systems.



The two guest lecture sessions also had the presence of Dr. Tej Pratap, Hon'ble Vice-Chancellor, Dr. S.K. Kashyap, Dean Agriculture; Dr. S.K. Guru, Nodal Officer (Academic), IDP-NAHEP; Dr. Ravi Mohan Srivastava, Professor, Entomology, College of Agriculture; Dr. Pankaj Kumar, Assistant Professor, College of Technology; and Dr. Manisha Rani, Nodal Officer (Procurement), IDP-NAHEP. The sessions were received with a positive response from the students who showed an active interest in the sessions concerning the new emerging trends and technologies in agriculture.





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
