Preamble

Collaborative venture under Public & Private Sector

The "GBPUA&T" and "ACPL" are convinced on reviewing the demand driven market value of artemisinin from *Artemisia annua* crop, that the plan for setting up an industrial unit for extraction & purification of artemisinin is economically viable & of utmost importance. Prior to setting up of industrial scale plant, "ACPL" will develop the extraction & purification plant of pilot scale at "GBPUA&T", based on procedure standardized by "GBPUA&T". The whole exercise from propagation & cultivation to extraction & purification of artemisinin will be under the collaborative mode.

It is realized that "GBPUA&T" has immense technical backup and strong links with the growers of medicinal and aromatic plants over the years for the various on going projects in the areas of Garhwal and Kumaon division for the last five decades. Brief Profile of "ACPL" is given elsewhere in this MOU.

Starting with Artemisia annua, the collaborative mode project will later on take up extraction & purification of industrially important crystals from the plants of high altitudes of Uttaranchal viz., Kuth, Kutki etc. This collaborative project will create industrial demand and simultaneously will change the economic scenario of growers of these plants and will make tremendous impact in improving financial health of the state.

The Scientific merit of this venture will take appropriate account of existing studies, originality and innovation in the scientific approaches and ideas, capacity building, strengthening and benefit sharing of both "GBPUA&T" scientists and "ACPL".

Memorandum of Understanding

The Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) is signed on the 31 day of Jan. 2006 BETWEEN G.B. Pant University of Agriculture & Technology, Pantnagar UA, INDIA (represented by Dr. Basant Ram, Director Experiment Stations) hence forth called "GBPUA&T" and Armaco Consultant Private Limited, A/6, Venus, Navroji Vakil Street, Nana Chowk, Grant Road, Mumbai, INDIA, (represented by Mr. Arvind Mathur, Director) henceforth called "ACPL".

Both the parties agree to carry out this collaborative venture on terms and conditions of the MOU to propagate, cultivate, extract and purify artemisinin from *Artemisia annua* and for launching of pilot scale plant for the extraction and purification of artemisinin, based on the procedures developed by "GBPUA&T" at Medicinal Research and Development Centre (MRDC).

Both the parties further agree to carry out this collaborative venture with in the time frame of 1.5 years starting from Jan 2006. The program of the project will be evaluated on a quarterly basis. An evaluation meeting will be validly constituted if there is a quorum of three fourths of the Members. A Member may request the Chairperson to convene a meeting of the Committee by giving at least 4 weeks' notice in writing.

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Scope of the Agreement

This Agreement sets forth the terms and conditions for collaboration of Armaco Consultant Private Limited.

Collaborative Venture - Scope of Activities

"GBPUA&T" Responsibilities

- Optimization of crop management practices for various genetic materials to get maximum productivity of artemisinin.
- Extraction of artemisinin at experimental scale.
- Purification protocols of extract in order to obtain artemisinin crystals.

"ACPL" Responsibilities

- Designing & implementation of pilot scale plant for extraction & purification to be erected at Medicinal Research and Development Centre (MRDC) "GBPUA&T" on free of cost based on laboratory techniques developed at "GBPUA&T".
- Supply of elite planting material/ seed material.
- Supply of equipments required to complete the pilot plant project

Proposed Area for Activity

- Field experiments for standardization, propagation and cultivation strategies for obtaining optimum productivity of artemisinin will be conducted at Medicinal Research and Development Centre (MRDC). Requirement of land for conducting the experiments will be approximately 1000m².
- The extraction and purification process will be conducted at Biochemistry lab of College of Basic Sciences & Humanities.
- 3. The pilot scale plant for extraction & purification of artemisinin will be established at MRDC, "GBPUA&T".

Term and Termination:

In case the production unit remains defunct for more than 18 months due to default or ceases to function by mutual consent, the fixed assets will be returned to "GBPUA&T" without any cost.

Ownership:

"GBPUA&T" shall have all the rights, on the infrastructure created for the project and entire movable and immovable properties shall remain with "GBPUA&T".

Collaboration:

The collaborative activity will be managed by a committee designated as screening Committee consisting of representatives of both the parties. The Management Committee will be headed by DES with the following composition:

- Efforts for research grants to collaborative venture, guided by the results of independent review and evaluation.
- Establish IPR Principles in an appropriate manner.

Budget and Disbursement

The functions of the Program Co-ordinator would be:

- To maintain an adequate set of books to record the financial transactions of the collaborative venture activity and make available information from such books to any party to this Agreement on request.
- To disburse the funds of the collaborative venture activity in accordance with the
- To stipulate in such budget when and how it requires payment of the amounts
- No act in the implementation of the Collaborative Venture activity shall be undertaken unless and until the Program Co-ordinator certifies that funds are available in accordance with such budget for the payment of any expenses incurred by such act.

The Start of propagation, cultivation operation & infrastructure development:

"ACPL" will start the implementation of the project by providing collected elite seed and plant materials & further activities will be conducted jointly by "GBPUA&T" & "ACPL" as per this MOU.

Value Creation:

The sharing of benefits on account of value addition will be carried out on equity basis between "GBPUA&T" and "ACPL".



General Provisions:

A. Force Majure:

Except for the obligation to pay monetary dues and owing, neither party shall be liable for any delay or failure in performance due to events outside the defaulting party's reasonable control including without limitation, acts of God, earthquake, labor disputes, shortage of supplies, riots, war, fire, epidemics or delays of common carriers or other circumstances beyond its reasonable control. The obligations and rights of excused party shall be extended on a day to day basis for the time period equal to the period, of the excusable delay.

B. Resources:

All labor issues, engagement terms and remuneration of all employees engaged in this project will be the responsibility of "ACPL" based on mutually agreed terms conditions.

C. Intellectual property ownership:

The information generated in the project will be the joint property of "GBPUA&T" & "ACPL". In case of any publication of information from the results of the project confidentiality will be maintained keeping the Company's interests.

D. Waiver:

No waiver of any right or remedy on one occasion by either party shall constitute a subsequent waiver of such right or remedy on any other occasion.

E. Assignment:

This agreement is not assignable by "ACPL", in whole or in part. Any such attempted assignment will be null and void.

F. Withdrawal of Member

A member may cease to be a member of the Collaborative Venture by giving one months' notice in writing to the Project Implementation Committee.

G. Relationship

This Agreement does create a collaborative relationship between the parties. Neither "ACPL" nor its employees shall be deemed to be a legal representative, agent, or employees of the "GBPUA&T". Either party has neither the right nor the authority to, and shall not assure or create any obligations of any nature on behalf of the party, or bind the other party in any interest.

H. Modification of Agreement:

This Agreement may only be modified by a written document executed by "GBPUA&T" & "ACPL". Notwithstanding any provision to the contrary in this Agreement, any resolution in writing signed by all Members to this Agreement shall constitute a decision of the Committee. This Agreement may be amended by a three fourths majority of the Members at a validly constituted Committee meeting.

I. Superceding of Previous Communications and Agreements:

This Agreement is a complete Agreement between the parties concerning the subject matter of this Agreement and replaces any prior Program related oral or written communications between the parties. Previous Agreements or communications not concerning the subject matter of this agreement are not amended or affected in any way by this agreement.

Any dispute arising during the project "Strategies for propagation, cultivation J. Arbitration: extract and purification of artemisinin crystal from Artemisia annua" would be resolved by the Vice Chancellor as a sole arbitrator. The decision of the Vice Chancellor would be final and binding upon both, the "GBPUA&T" & "ACPL". No suit will lie against the decision of sole arbitrator in any court of law. The Arbitration proceedings shall be conducted expeditiously and with due regard to the expenses that may be incurred by any party. The Committee shall have first attempt to resolve such dispute at two consecutive meetings prior to referring such matter accordingly.

K. Miscellaneous:

- Each Member enters into this agreement as a Member of an unincorporated

- The Members are not entitled to transfer or assign their membership of the Joint Venture without the written approval of the Committee.
- The Members to this agreement agree and undertake that they shall conduct their relations with each other arising from this agreement in a spirit of good faith, and they shall not cause the Collaborative Venture Program, or any part thereof, to be delayed or suspended as a result of any dispute save for good and proper reasons arising out of this agreement.

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INTERNATIONAL MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING

between

G.B. Pant University of Agriculture and Technology, Pantnagar, Uttaranchal Pradesh, India

and

Iowa State University of Science and Technology, Ames, Iowa, USA

I. Preamble

This International Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) constitutes an agreement between G.B. Pant University of Agriculture and Technology, Pantnagar, Uttaranchal Pradesh, India, and the Iowa State University of Science and Technology, USA, to join in a strategic alliance to undertake a series of cooperative activities of common interest and mutual benefit.

In accordance with the objective to promote further cooperation between India and the United States of America, G.B. Pant University of Agriculture and Technology, Pantnagar, Uttaranchal Pradesh, India, and the Iowa State University hereby jointly enter into a bilateral linkage, focusing on the development of their institutions' programs, particularly those in research, teaching and extension. They will jointly develop and implement activities to improve their capacities to serve their respective clientele in India and the United States of America. This linkage is developed based upon the institutions' commonality of interests and their belief that a linkage between them would strengthen their joint and individual capacities.

II. Objectives

The objectives of this linkage are to develop long-term activities. Where financially feasible and consistent with the policies of G.B. Pant University of Agriculture and Technology, India and the Board of Regents of the State of Iowa, and all other governing legislation, the parties agree to pursue mutual interest in the following types of activities:

<u>Long-term and short-term exchanges of faculty and staff</u>: Sabbaticals, faculty improvement leaves, visiting professorships, research collaboration, and other activities in areas of mutual interest and expertise are contemplated.

*Programs relating to research, teaching, and /or outreach: These programs may encompass any discipline to the extent that suitable counterparts exist.

Encouragement of applications from students to study at the partner institution at the undergraduate and/or graduate level: Students who meet regular admissions requirements of the host institution may be admitted to academic programs. The

term(s) of attendance, costs, and course of study will be determined individually for each student in accordance with standard admissions procedures for international students.

III. Program Management

Each activity will be jointly planned, implemented, and evaluated, and will be described in a plan of work which will include programmatic and budget details. Activities undertaken will permit publication, dissemination, and sharing by the two institutions of all the facts resulting from the activities. Exchange and dissemination of information will include both the exchange of working papers on joint research and the identification of materials for publication. No prohibition of publication will be imposed by either institution.

This MOU does not obligate either institution to provide funding or direct support for future collaborative activities. However, either institution, or both, may choose to provide support on a case-by-case basis. It is further understood that both institutions will jointly and separately seek funding from third parties to support activities to be carried out under this MOU. Implementation of specific collaborative programs will depend upon the availability of funds. The G.B. Pant University of Agriculture and Technology, Pantnagar, Uttaranchal Pradesh, India and the Iowa State University, Ames, Iowa, USA will assist one another with applications to funding sources for financial support of this cooperation and exchange.

Each institution has designated an individual to serve as a point of contact. These officials are identified below:

The representatives mentioned above will be responsible for monitoring program activities in the framework of this MOU, promoting achievement of the objectives of the agreement and reporting to their respective institutions the advances made.

This Memorandum will be in effect for five years, commencing on the date of the last signature affixed to this document. At the end of this period, each institution will review the types and extent of collaborative activities undertaken and determine whether or not the MOU should be renewed. The Memorandum can be amended, with the approval of both parties, by means of

exchange of letters through the authorized officials at each institution. Either party may initiate the exchange of letters.

The Memorandum may be terminated by either party by giving written notice of the intent to terminate the MOU. Such termination shall not affect the execution and conclusion of specific activities in effect under terms of this MOU, nor publication and dissemination of results of research in progress. Insofar as possible, such notice will be given three months in advance of the desired termination date.

This Memorandum constitutes the entire agreement between parties. All prior discussions, agreements, and understandings, whether verbal or in writing, are merged in this MOU. For conditions of the affiliation not covered by this MOU or for problems that arise while the MOU is in effect, both parties agree to refrain from unilateral action and to consult and negotiate agreeable decisions. This Memorandum is designed to facilitate and develop a genuine and mutually beneficial process of cooperation and exchange and is not a contract creating legal or financial relationships between the parties. The parties do not discriminate on the basis of age, marital status, race, gender, ethnicity, religion, or disability.

IN WITNESS THEREOF: The G.B. Pant University of Agriculture and Technology, Pantnagar, Uttaranchal Pradesh, India and Iowa State University, Ames, Iowa, USA have executed this International Memorandum of Understanding as of the last date affixed below.

Noting the fact that the State Vaccine Institute (SVI) at Patwadangar, which was established in 1903 and is spread across 103 acres, discontinued production of vaccines owing to technology obsolescence in 2003; the Government of Uttaranchal has desired that the SVI be developed as a biotech hub, in line with its broader vision to position Patwadangar as a satellite knowledge township.

For this purpose:

The Government has taken a decision to transfer the SVI to the Biotechnology Department of GBPUA&T for this initiative. Pursuant to the survey of the site, GBPUA&T has proposed to modernize the vaccine manufacturing facility to

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Institute to focus on vaccine research and to tie up with a leading private vaccine manufacturer to establish a full-scale vaccine production facility on the SVI campus.

- B. The Consultant has submitted an Expression of Interest (EOI) in response to a public tender and has been awarded the mandate to develop the concept of Patwadangar as a knowledge township with the biotechnology hub as the nucleus, based on its technical credentials.
- C. The Consultant has agreed to carry out the Services as defined in the Scope of Work (enclosed as Annexure-1) on mutually agreed terms & conditions listed hereinafter.

Definitions, Language, Address of the Parties and Notified Person:

Definitions

Unless the context otherwise requires, the terms as listed below, wherever used in this Contract, will have the following meaning:-

- "Client" means G.B. Pant University of Agriculture & Technology
- "Consultant refers to Ernst & Young Pvt. Ltd.
- "Contract" means this Contract between G.B. Pant University of Agriculture & Technology and the Consultant
- "Contract price" means the price to be paid for the performance of the Services.
- "Contract period" means the period during which the Contract is valid and has not expired.
- "Party" means G.B. Pant University of Agriculture & Technology or the Consultant, as the case may be, and Parties means both of them.
- "Project" means the project for which G.B. Pant University of Agriculture & Technology has engaged the professional services of the Consultant and of which the Services form a part.

4. **Notices**





MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING

Agricultural & Processed Food Products Export Development Authority (APEDA) an apex body under the Ministry of Commerce & industry, Government of India, is mandated, inter alia, to promote the export oriented production and development of the products listed in the schedule to the APEDA Act 1986. APEDA works for the improvement of packaging and marketing of the mandated products and arranges training in various aspects of the agri and food processing for promotion and development of the export of these products.

APEDA has entered into an MoU with United National Conference on Trade & Development (UNCTAD) to implement a project, "Strategies and Preparedness for Trade and Globalisation in India" for Agriculture Sector as Tier 1 Partner. The project will address the needs of the agri and food products sector to build up the capacity of various stakeholders through support for implementation of identified Trade Related Capacity Building (TRCB) activities.

The project has two components. The component I of the project focuses on 'upstream' activities (assisting trade negotiators and policy makers), while the component II of the project will facilitate downstream actions, such as building stakeholder capacities for understanding and managing the impact of globalisation on their respective constituencies and equip them to take better informed decisions and formulate their strategies with a greater level of understanding of the issues. As a Tier I partner of Component II of the project, APEDA will be responsible for conducting TRCB in the Agriculture sector in accordance with the principles, guidelines and objectives set forth in this Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) signed with UNCTAD. APEDA in turn will implement the project across the country partnering through various stakeholders of the sector. These partners will be called as Tier-II Partners. In order to take the objectives ahead, APEDA will enter into MoUs with the partners. The objective of this MoU is to provide a framework for a partnership arrangement between APEDA and the concerned stakeholders (Tier II Partner) for ensuring close cooperation and coordination of efforts concerning to dissemination, research, training and consultancy related to international trade.

In accordance with their respective areas of specialization, the APEDA and the Tier II Partner will share and exchange relevant information and documentation on a regular basis; conduct regular consultation at the sector/cluster level to identify and carry out potential joint research projects, besides development of user friendly tools for dissemination to the industry and other stakeholders through seminars/symposia/workshops etc. in the designated textile clusters in the country.

This co-operation between the APEDA and the Tier II Partner is non-exclusive and mutually free of charge.

The funds will be made available for implementing the activities under the project. However, the activities and size of the funds requirement will be decided in consultation with APEDA and UNCTAD.

The Parties hereby confirm their commitment to jointly work in accordance with the principles, processes and procedures set forth in this document in order to contribute to the success of the Project.

This MoU shall initially be valid for two years form the date of signing. Both the organizations would review the effect of this co-operation periodically, and if such evaluation is positive, the MoU would be extended on mutually acceptable conditions.



GOVIND BALLABH PANT UNIVERSITY OF AGRICULTURE & TECHNOLOGY, PANTNAGAR an University established in 1960 under the Uttar Pradesh Act, 1958 (Act XI –V of 1958) having its registered Office at Pantnagar, District- Udhamsinghnagar, Uttaranchal – 263145 ((hereinafter referred to as GBPUAT, which expression shall, unless repugnant to the context or meaning hereof, be deemed to include its successors and permitted assigns) of the OTHER PART.

The MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING for Promotion of Jatropha cultivation, procurement and its value addition in association with GBPUAT, Pantnagar will be entered between BHARAT HERBALS & ORGANICS, PVT. LTD. and GOVIND

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BALLABH PANT UNIVERSITY OF AGRICULTURE & TECHNOLOGY, PANTNAGAR.

WHEREAS both BHO and GBPUAT agree that it is in their own mutual interest to enter into an Agreement to give effect to this joint programme.

NOW THIS MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING WITNESSETH AND RECORDS THE UNDERSTANDING REACHED BETWEEN THE PARTIES HERETO:

This **MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING** is for the purpose of executing a joint programme for Promotion of Jatropha cultivation, procurement and its value addition.

1. Memorandum of Understanding:

Between Bharat Herbals & Organics, Pvt. Ltd. 45, GMS road, Dehradun, Uttaranchal & Govind Ballabh Pant University of Agriculture & Technology, Pantnagar, Uttaranchal for promotion of Jatropha cultivation with technological support and research back up

2. Preamble: BHO is currently involved in purchasing and marketing of all the certified organic produce in association with Govt. of Uttaranchal. The main thrust of the company is organic produce and its value addition with the main objective of the economic upliftment of small and marginal farmers of the hill state.

GBPUAT, Pantnagar is working on its mandate of teaching, research and transformation of technology to the farmers.

3. Purpose of MoU: Promotion, cultivation, procurement and value addition in Jatropha with association of GBPUAT, Pantnagar

4. Definitions:

- Cultivation means expansion of Jatropha in farmer's fields and in Van-Panchayats.
- Procurement means Buyback arrangement of Jatropha seeds with offering farm gate price to the farmers.
- Plant (nursery)-means propagation of Jatropha plants
- Technological Support- to make aware the farmers and other stakeholders about the package and practices of Jatropha cultivation.

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- Capacity Building- training and skill up-gradation of farmers.
- Research- Propagation of high yielding varieties and support to the farmers in adverse conditions.
- 5. Implementations framework: The BHO will require minimum 25 lakh plants of Jatropha (sapling stage) per year for which the cost of saplings @ Rs. 1 per plant will be provided to GBPUAT by BHO as 50% in advance before the month of March in the respective year. The BHO will be responsible for complete arrangement of land, plantation and the procurement of seed produce. The GBPUAT will provide the complete agrotechnolgy and training back-up to BHO on the prescribed fee as decided by steering committee.

6. Partners Responsibilities:

G.B. Pant University will offer following services:

- Produce minimum 25 lacs high yielding plants per year and increase according to the requirement, by the mutual understanding.
- Provide technical know-how to the second party.
- Provide research back-up support to the second party.
- University will organize regular field visits at farmer's field.
- University will organize seeds and high quality planting material from Maharastra and Chattishgarh or any other such place as may be deemed fit by their own sources.

The BHO commits to:

- Smooth organization of specialized training programmes for farmers.
- Entrust GBPUAT, Pantnagar for monitoring and evaluation of Jatropha plantation with suitable logistic and financial help.
- 7. Compensation and Benefits: If first party did not lift the plants contracted for a particular year it is liable to pay all the due cost incurred equal to the value of plants.

Second party if unable to provide the required plants contracted for a particular year is liable to pay the loss incurred to the first party equal to the value of the plants not received at the time of plantation, provided the condition in clause 5 is fulfilled by first party.

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- 8. Terms and Conditions: As laid by steering committee.
- 9. Steering Committee: The steering committee for this MoU will be as follows:

Director, BHO: Member

CA, BHO: member

Director Extension: Member

Coordinator Jatropha, GBPUAT: Member Secretary

- 10. Marketing and Trading: This will be the responsibility of first party.
- 11. General provisions: This MoU shall come into force from the day aforesaid and will be valid for the period of 60 months. Both the parties on mutual agreement may renew the validity of MoU for next five years.

BHO would give first preference to the students of the University as and when required for employment opportunities in the company.

- 12. Arbitration: The Vice-chancellor, GBPUAT, Pantnagar will be the sole arbitrator and his decision would be binding on both the parties.

1. TERMS

2. SCOPE OF STRATEGIC ALLIANCE

The areas where YES BANK and CABM would cooperate, where mutually agreed upon are discussed below.

4. Consultancy for YES BANK projects – YES BANK will utilize technical advisory services of CABM for specific commercial mandates being undertaken by YES BANK. These would be limited to the projects undertaken by YES BANK either on its own or on behalf of its clients. Such specific fee based technical advisory services contract shall be discussed and entered into based on mutual agreement between CABM and YES BANK.

 Business Development activities – YES BANK has linkages (financial and advisory) with many Research & Development and Technically oriented Corporates requiring advisory services. YES BANK may introduce such Corporates to CABM for business as well as recruitments.

 Joint assignments – YES BANK and CABM will jointly bid for undertaking strategic consultancy assignments. The fee-sharing mechanism on such assignments will be worked out on a project specific basis.

 Other Activities- Parties hereby agree that on mutual agreement based on the relationship between the Parties, the scope of activity may be increased or decreased as the case may be.

3. INTELLECTUAL PROPERTY RIGHTS AND INDEMNITIES

Any consulting advisory and project development services provided by YES BANK to CABM shall not in any manner infringe the intellectual property right of any third party. Further, YES BANK ensures that the Intellectual Property of CABM shared with YES BANK is not infringed by YES BANK. YES BANK shall ensure that the inventories, developments, innovations produced by CABM are protected and owned by CABM and vice versa, unless it is expressly assigned to YES BANK under a Consultancy Project that is considered "work made for hire" and all assignment of rights to YES BANK and its Client is essential as per the terms of the engagements.

4. CABM REPRESENTS

CABM represents and warrants that the area on which MAP and IADP is proposed to be set up is owned by CABM or has been obtained on lease basis. CABM represents that it has the right, consent or approval, as required to develop the projects on the said areas.

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5. RELATED DOCUMENTS

This MOU shall constitute the main working document for relationship between YES BANK and CABM. The parties agree to enter into definitive agreement from time to time for provision of any of the services described herein above which will provide for the rights and obligations of the parties for the particular mandate/ assignment/ project.

General Clauses

1. Force Majeure / Acts of God:

This MOU is subject to force majeure situations. It shall be subject to inabilities based on circumstances beyond the control and power of contracting Parties, such as civil commotion, riots, war, hacking, unauthorized access, spam, etc. which may result in the vagaries of the general financial markets.

2. Disclaimer

Neither party guarantees success of any project or assignment undertaken under this MOU.

3. Confidentiality

Neither party shall be entitled to use either party's trademark/logo without the prior written approval of the other party. The parties also agree that any developmental activities taking effect as a result of MoU should only be implemented on mutual consent of both the contracting parties.

CABM and YES BANK agree that they shall not, at any time of under any circumstances, without the written consent of the other party, directly or indirectly communicate or disclose to any person (other than their employees, agents, advisors, auditors and representatives) about the MOU, except during cases highlighted below:

(a) Information that is required for progressing business opportunities;

(b) Information already in the possession of a Party;

(c) Information which is or becomes generally available to the public;

(d) Information, which is reasonably required to be disclosed by a Party to protect its interest in connection with any valuation or legal proceedings; provided that the Party so required to disclose such information, shall immediately intimate the other party of the same.

(e) Information that is required to be disclosed by law or by the applicable regulations or policies of any regulatory agency of competent jurisdiction or any stock exchange.

The Parties also agree that, subject to the aforesaid clause, they will inform each other prior to releasing any persons statements or other publicity regarding the MOU or the transactions contemplated by this MOU.

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Both Parties agree and bind themselves to the fact that all or any of the information, which is property of the other Party, shall be treated as confidential and no party shall disclose the said information without the prior approval of other in writing.

The provisions of this Clause herein above pertaining to the said confidential information shall survive the termination of the MOU for a period of 1 year from the date of such termination.

4. Compensation

Unless otherwise agreed upon, neither party shall be under an obligation to compensate the other for any work undertaken or for any expenses incurred in relation to this MOU or in connection with any negotiations or activities prior to entering into legally binding definitive agreements and all such costs and expenses shall be borne by the respective party incurring them.

On a project-specific basis, CABM and YES BANK will work towards developing appropriate fee sharing mechanisms on advisory/consultancy / project development assignments jointly undertaken. The expenditures for typing, postage, stamp duty etc. necessary for signing the proposed MOU shall be borne by Yes Bank.

5. Amendments and Waivers

No amendment in this MOU shall be valid or binding unless set forth in writing and duly executed by the Parties to this MOU. No waiver of any breach of any provision of this MOU shall be effective or binding unless made in writing and signed by the party purporting to give such waiver and unless otherwise provided in the written waiver, shall be limited to the specific breach waived.

6. Termination

Both Parties confirm that they are competent to enter into such an MOU under their respective laws of Corporate/States/Country. This MOU shall be effective as on the date of execution and shall continue in full force unless terminated.

Either Party may terminate this MOU due to breach of terms agreed to in this MOU by other party. However, the party aggrieved by the breach shall give written notice to other party to this MOU indicating that the MOU shall be terminated not earlier than 30 days from the date of the receipt of the notice if the breach is not cured. Either Party may terminate this MOU even without breach by giving 60 days notice in writing but such termination will not affect term 3 and the general clauses 3, 4, 5,6,7,8 and 10.

7. Exclusivity

This Agreement shall be on a non - exclusive basis, provided that CABM shall not enter into any agreement for availing similar services agreed herein with any other third party for setting up MAP or IADP.

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8. Indemnity

Pant University, Pantnagar. The language of arbitration shall be in English and venue shall be Pantnagar Distt. U.S. Nagar of Uttaranchal State.

10. Severability

If any provision of the MOU should be or become wholly or partly ineffective, all other provisions remain valid. The parties to this MOU will undertake all necessary steps and actions to replace the ineffective provision by an effective provision which comes as close as possible to the purpose of the ineffective provision.

11. Statutory Compliances

YES BANK and CABM agree that all services rendered and operations conducted pursuant to this MOU shall be in compliance with all legislations, statutes, ordinances, regulations, administrative rulings or requirements of law.

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AGREEMENT FOR CULTIVATION OF JATROPHA BY GB PANT UNIVERSITY OF AGRICULTURE & TECHNOLOGY, PANTNAGAR

AGREEMENT is in continuation of the MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING (MOU) for CULTIVATION OF JATROPHA AND ALLIED ACTIVITIES dated the 20th day of January 2006 entered into between HINDUSTAN PETROLEUM CORPORATION LIMITED and GOVINDH BALLABH PANT UNIVERSITY OF AGRICULTURE AND TECHNOLOGY.

WHEREAS both HPCL and GBPUAT agree that it is in their own mutual interest to enter into an Agreement to give effect to this joint programme.

NOW THIS AGREEMENT WITNESSETH AND UNDERSTANDING REACHED BETWEEN THE PARTIES HERETO: RECORDS THE

- 1. This Agreement is for the purpose of executing a joint programme for cultivation of 10 lakh elite Jatropha plants under standard agronomic practices.
- 2. The action plan for the above is as under:

1) Raising of Nursery - March 2006

- 2) Planting 5 lakh Jatropha saplings July 2006
- 3) Planting another 5 lakh Jatropha saplings- July 2007

Complete responsibility for these activities is on GBPUAT.

- 3. Land availability for the plantation of Jatropha will be the sole responsibility of
- 4. Complete agro technology will be disseminated to the growers by GBPUAT
- 5. The seeds produced from the cultivation will be converted into Bio-diesel for
- 6. Funds to be provided to GBPUAT for the cultivation of 10 lakh plants:

- HPCL shall provide funds equivalent to Rs 116.76 lakh (Rs. One Crore Sixteen Lakh Seventy Six Thousand only) for the above said programme as mentioned above.
- 8. The activities covered under this Agreement shall be developed through consultation between HPCL and GBPUAT.
- GBPUAT will provide justifications to HPCL for all the above items i.e.
 infrastructure, equipments, accessories and others during the project
 implementation prior to and also after incurring the expenditure.
- 10. A monitoring team having equal number of members from HPCL / their representatives & GBPUAT will review & monitor the work on half yearly basis and report to Director- Research, GBPUAT & Director - Marketing, HPCL
- 11. There shall be an Advisory Committee which shall consist of the following members:
 - (1) Director Research, GBPUAT, Pantnagar
 - (2) Director Extension, GBPUAT, Pantnagar
 - (3) Director Mktg, HPCL, Mumbai- Member
 - (4) General Manager Q.C. & R&D, HPCL, Mumbai Member
 - (5) Dy. General Manager- R&D, HPCL, Mumbai-Member
 - (6) Co-coordinator Jatropha , GBPUAT, Pantnagar
- 12. The Advisory Committee shall review and approve all the activities that will be carried out between GBPUAT and HPCL under this Agreement.
- 13. Any change/modifications to this Agreement would be effected by both parties on mutual consent in writing.
- 14. It is fully understood and agreed between both parties that this Agreement is recorded and signed for the sole purpose of advancing their mutual

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business/commercial interest and this Agreement in any event will not confer any right to either of them against the other except those specifically mentioned herein.

- 15. In case of any dispute, the Vice-chancellor, GBPUAT, Pantnagar and Director Marketing, HPCL, upon mutual consent shall appoint the sole arbitrator whose decision shall be final and binding on both parties. The arbitration shall be governed by the provisions of the Arbitration and Conciliation Act, 1996. The place of arbitration shall be at Pantnagar, district: Udham Singh Nagar, Uttaranchal.
- 16. This Agreement is for a period of 10 (Ten) years which may be further extended by another 5 (Five) years by mutual consent of both HPCL & GBPUA&T. Neither party shall terminate the Agreement before the end of the validity period mentioned in the Agreement.

17. Indemnity:

GBPUAT shall hold HPCL harmless and indemnify HPCL against any and all liability in the course of performance of the Agreement namely,

- a) Any death, injury or illness of any employee, Agent or any Contractor of GBPUAT.
- b) Any physical loss or damage to GBPUAT's premises.
- c) Any death, injury or illness of any third party or damage to the property of third party as a result of an accident in GBPUAT's premises.

18. Confidentiality:

- 18.1 Both the parties and their employees, consultants and agents shall hold in confidence all documents and other information, whether technical or commercial supplied to it by or on behalf of the other Party and all information and documents obtained by it in the course of any inspection or otherwise in accordance with the terms of this Agreement, and shall not, save as required by law or appropriate regulatory authorities, publish or otherwise disclose or use the same for its own purposes otherwise than as may be required to perform its obligations under this Agreement.
- 18.2 The provisions of paragraph 18.1 above shall not apply to:
 - i) Any information in the public domain otherwise than by breach of this Agreement;
 - ii) Information in the possession of the receiving Party thereof before divulgence as aforesaid, and which was not obtained under any obligation of confidentiality; and
 - iii) Information obtained from a third party who is free to divulge the same, and which is not obtained under any obligation of confidentiality.

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19. HPCL shall recover its investment in this project by uplifting entire quantity of Biodiesel produced by GBPUA&T. The profits from the production of Biodiesel will be shared equally by HPCL & GBPUA&T. No other payments will be made against upliftment of Biodiesel by HPCL. The cost of Biodiesel for calculation of recovery of investment by HPCL will be considered as per "Purchase Policy of Biodiesel", announced by MOP&NG" or the mutually agreed price between HPCL & GBPUA&T. The current price of Biodiesel as per Purchase Policy of Biodiesel

1- It is understood that ceiling cost of the Project will remain Rs.167.00Lacs as sanctioned vide F.N.-3-19/2005-EP & D Dated 18-01-06 subject that flow of funds is maintained by client as per clause 3 of the memorandum of understanding. In case there is revision of cost due to reasons mentioned below the detailed Project Report will be submitted by UPRNN to the university for sanction from Government.

2- It is understood that UPRNN shall start actual work only after the "client" has (1) communicated in writing to UPRNN its Administrative and financial sanction of the preliminary estimates based on the estimate approved by the government and (3) within THIRTY (30) days the issue to 'letter of Indent, by the client deposited with UPRNN sufficient advance being not less than 25% of the estimated cost. The UPRNN shall start the work within 30 days with effect from the last date of the three dates as above.

It is understood that at the time of allotment of work, flow of funds shall be mutually decided in accordance with the expected/desired progress of work (by the client) as per 3annexure VI.

4- Centage Charges:

(b) The UPRNN shall execute and completely finish the project within Stipulated time from the date of receipt of 25% amount of the estimated cost as advance subject to cash flow as per clause-3, above, unless prevented by any Labour Strikes, Fire accident, Earthquake, Mob-violence, attack from the air or any

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other major disturbance (force meajure) or any other reasons beyond the control of the UPRNN. This Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) is made between Himalayan Institute Hospital Trust (HIHT)(herein after referred to HIHT) as nodal agency & Govind Bhallabh Pant University of Agriculture and Technology (G.B.P.U.A.T.) (herein after referred to GBPUAT), Pantnagar for offering/ committing the expertise services for Village Resource Centers(herein after referred to VRCs) in Uttaranchal.

WHEREAS, HIHT, Sri Bhuvaneshwari Mahila Ashram (SBMA), Central Himalayan Rural Action Group (CHIRAG) & Institute of Himalayan Environmental Research & Education (INHERE) proposes to set up a number of Village Resource Centers (VRCs) in association with Indian Space Research Organization (ISRO), Dept. of Space, Government of India in different parts of Uttaranchal starting with year 2006.

VRCs are envisaged as the single window delivery mechanism for a variety of space based products and services such as tele-education, tele-medicines, information on natural resources for planning and development at locale level, interactive advisories on agriculture, fisheries, land and water resource management, disaster management, livestock management; etc., interactive vocational training towards alternate livelihood, e-governance services, weather information, etc. The VRCs will also address variety of social aspects locally and even act as help lines.

WHEREAS, VRCs will be provided with satellite connectivity for tele-education, tele-medicine, natural resource management and related activities by Indian Space Research Organization (ISRO), Dept. of Space, Government of India.

WHEREAS GBPUAT located at Pantnagar has technical expertise in the field of agriculture, and it would be to the advantage of the VRC programme, if GBPUAT were to be associated with this programme for interactive advisories on agriculture, fisheries, land and water resource management, disaster management, livestock management purposes:

WHEREAS each of signatories to this MOU agree to co-operate in the establishment and management of the VRCs, specifically for tele-agriculture services to VRCs.

AND WHEREAS, the specific role and responsibilities of, and financial implications on each of the signatories to this MOU for the establishment and management of the VRCs referred to hereinabove, shall be discussed and finalized mutually.

In order to facilitate international academic exchange, to develop academic and scientific relationships, and in support of collaborative research activities G.B.Pant University of Agriculture and Technology(GBPUAT) and Cornell University's College of Agriculture and Life Sciences (CALS) agree to establish this Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) as a framework for cooperative programs.

ARTICLE I University Personnel Exchange and Visits

It is agreed that linkages will be strengthened by university personnel visits and exchanges between the collaborating institutions. The purpose is to exchange scientific information and develop specific cooperative projects and programs. Arrangements for each such visit will be made under the aegis of the institutions. Purpose, timing and other details concerning exchanges and short visits shall be mutually acceptable to the institutions. It is agreed that information concerning the purpose and duration of faculty and/or student visits, the research backgrounds of personnel and further details, as required, will be provided to the host institution at least two months prior to the proposed visit.

ARTICLE II Cooperative Research

It is recognized that significant opportunities will exist for cooperative research at the collaborating institutions. Such clearly beneficial activities may require specific arrangements. In view of the importance of cooperative research, collaborating institutions agree to give a high priority to this within their overall relationships.

ARTICLE III Areas of Academic Interest

Every effort will be made to encourage productive relationships and exchanges in all agricultural related fields identified by interested members of collaborating institutions.

ARTICLE IV Post Graduate Degree Training

The collaborating institutions recognize that there are considerable benefits when graduate students are provided with opportunities for conducting at least some of their research abroad. Efforts will

be made, accordingly, to expand opportunities toward this objective. Arrangements to this end will be considered initially on a case-by-case basis. It is agreed that as much as practicable, graduatelevel research and training will be considered an essential component for inclusion in externally funded projects. Short-term, non-degree training will also be considered as part of this agreement.

With respect to student programs, the acceptance of students for research, course work or full programs will be dependent on meeting the academic criteria of the host institution, and on visa and other requirements of the host country.

ARTICLE V **Exchange of Scientific Materials**

Collaborating parties agree to exchange as widely as is practicable such items as scientific publications and journals, university calendars, prospectuses, text books, course outlines and reference materials.

ARTICLE VI **Duration of MOU**

This MOU shall come into effect when signed by all parties and have a duration of five years, after which extension, modification or other changes may be made as agreed to by all parties. Within the initial five-year period, the terms of the Memorandum of Understanding may be altered or terminated as required, subject to approval by each institution.

ARTICLE VII **Procedures**

The administration of this MOU will be the responsibility of the International Programs/CALS at Cornell University. Dr. Ronnie Coffman will be the primary contact at Cornell. The Vice Chancellor of GBPUAT, will serve as the primary contact at GBPUAT, Pantnagar - 263145, Dist. Udham Singh Nagar, Uttaranchal (India).
