THE AUSTRALIA-INDIA LAND AND WATER CONSERVATION Virtual Exchange

OVERVIEW

This virtual exchange will provide a unique opportunity for undergraduate students to engage in an online global learning experience. This program will take a deeper look at *urban water*, *farming practices and conservation systems*, through a sustainability lens, between Australia and India contexts. During the virtual exchange students will undertake a comparative scientific research project, network with international peers and experts, and engage in cultural immersion to build a life-long learning and connections to the Indo-Pacific.

Students will engage virtually (online) over an 8-week period through live and self-led learning activities.

Learning activities will be made up of a mixture of live Zoom discussions, cultural activities, and/or independent peer-peer research project work.

Students are expected to participate in each session to successfully complete and receive their e-certificate.

REQUIREMENTS TO PARTICIPATE


- Your own laptop or computer, with access to good internet connection.
